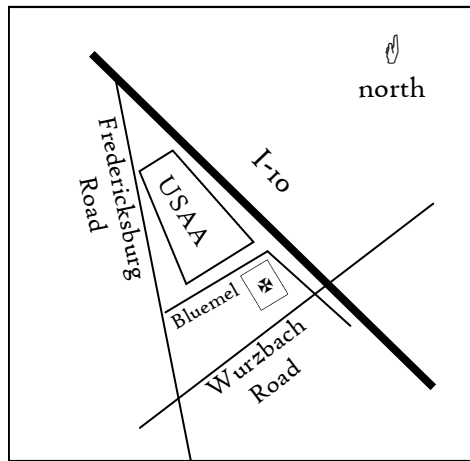

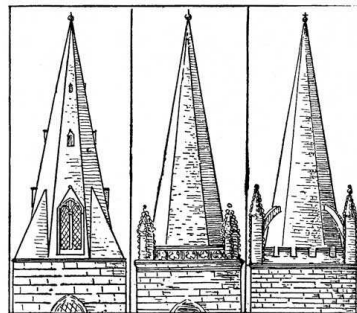

# Welcome to St. Francis- upon-the-hill!

In 16th-century England, the day of the village fair was eagerly anticipated. There were artisans and fortunetellers, jesters and acrobats, musicians and all kinds of savory foods. For that one day, the classes mingled—gentry rubbed shoulders with peasants, aristocrats spoke to gypsies.



St. Francis Episcopal Church wants to recreate that atmosphere. Our goal is to make our Faire as entertaining as it is educational, with something to interest everyone. We are looking for vendors with an interest in the time period and the enthusiasm to dress and decorate as merchants did in 1565.

Proceeds from booth rentals and admission fees will benefit the joint programs of St. Francis and Family Service Association. Won't you join us as we step back in time?

## General Rules for Vendors

1. Faire hours are Saturday, March 3, 2012, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., rain or shine. Booths can be set up Friday, March 2, after noon, and must remain up and running until 5 p.m. Saturday.
2. Vehicles must be parked in designated parking areas, not at booths.
3. Booth spaces are 10' by 10'; tents and canopies will not be provided. Vendors must bring their own tables, chairs, identification signs or banners, etc.
4. Vendors are strongly encouraged to dress in period clothing and to decorate their booths in the Renaissance theme.
5. Booth may remain up Friday night, but no security will be provided; we recommend that vendors set up only tents and other structures, but keep the contents elsewhere until Saturday. Neither St. Francis Episcopal Church nor its representatives will be responsible for loss, damage, or injury of any kind.

\$45 for 10'by 10' space  
\$35 with regular demonstrations

### Food Booth:

\$50 for 10'x10' space

\$10 extra (limited availability)
